23/57 Cllrs Taylor & Delaney declared an interest in the Community Space rent as the church wardens.

23/58 Public Speaking -

Cllr S Bull (DCC)

Cllr Bull reported that the main issues for the DCC have been flooding, downed trees and potholes. Some of the pot holes are being done more than once as filling them whilst wet is causing them to pop out again once it freezes. It was reported that the pot hole at Painters Lane coming out of Brailsford is really bad. Cllr Bull has been round Hall Lane and Mill Lane to report the pot holes. The verges outside the Heath's house have disappeared due to the water and the drains and gullies are blocked in places as well. The Gullies are subcontracted to DDDC. Cllr Bull suggested finding out who the company is to ask for a report next time they are coming around.

Park Lane was raised and it was noted that it should be included in the 30mph limit. Cllr Bull will speak to the cabinet member and ask for a review. It was noted that it was a heavily used road in summer due to the football teams using the field.

Devolution and the East Midlands Mayoral elections on the 2nd May were raised. It was noted that funding would be required to help clear the £39 million DCC deficit which will be cleared this year but it will have an impact on following years. It was noted that Cllr Bull's parish grant funding will be halved.

Flooding down at Hollington is causing a problem and it doesn't seem to be draining so the pipe might be blocked.

- 23/61 Matters Arising from the last meeting (non-decision making)
 - 1. Speeding No current reports. This item will be left on the agenda so incidents can be reported when they occur.

- 2. Queen's Memorial Plaque update Cllr Delaney reported that she has had approval for the plaque to be put in the church and the plaque will be placed once it arrives.
- 3. The Boardwalk was raised and it has been reported but still waiting on work.
- 4. Hedges on Hall Lane and Park Lane require further cutting but some cutting has been done. (Osmaston Estate)
- 23/62 Community Space Rent the Clerk gave a summary on the situation with the Community Space up to the present point. Cllr Leeney noted that the Coffee Morning is a priceless resource but that the cost of £30ph is too much. It was noted that the PCC have informed Cllr Walker that the costs will most likely be rising in the next year potentially up to a further 20% over the £30ph rate due to costs though no rate for 2024/25 is available at this time. The Clerk with the assistance of Cllr Leeney have supplied a letter to the users of the space and residents raising this issue and asking for a plan to move forward but there has been no response from users as

of yet. It was noted that 2 residents object to the Council spending more than the £4500 on the space given that much of the village don't use it and Parish Council funds come from Council Tax paid by every house in the village. It was also noted that the Community Space currently made up more than a half of the Parish Council's proposed budget for a relatively small number of users.

It was **RESOLVED** to put forward £4500 to fund all groups use of the community space for 2024/25. Proposed by Cllr Crabtree and Seconded by Cllr Leeney.

It was agreed that if the rate rises other solutions will have to be found for the groups.
